

Our Journey Together 3rd Early Childhood Convening


The Alliance hosted their 3rd Early Childhood Convening on January 11. There were about 70 participants representing families, early childhood coalitions, early childhood Regions, family resource centers, head start, child care programs, early childhood funders

LINKING TO LIBRARIES

The Capital Area (Region 2) has been reaching out to all the libraries in our region. The goal of reaching out to the libraries is 2 fold first and foremost we want to help increase the capacity of the libraries to help support youth and families through funding projects in a couple different realms.

Environment - Creating or enhancing child- or family-friendly and/or quality learning spaces through furniture, equipment, and materials, etc. For example, creating a designated toddler room; installing a story walk; creating outdoor spaces for activities

Supplies and Equipment

Some examples: A workshop designed to teach parents how to use early literacy behaviors daily with their babies and young children may utilize funds for the items (books, puppets, take-home materials) that promote those activities and increasing the number of books available in the primary languages spoken within the community served.

The <u>Family Place Libraries™ initiative</u> is a national model for transforming public libraries into welcoming, developmentally appropriate early learning environments for very young children, their parents and caregivers. Family Place Libraries™ are committed to developing a family-centered approach to library services.

We are trying to create lasting partnerships with these underutilized community pillars and help support the libraries as entry points to access information on all social services. This is being done by asking the libraries what resources they already have and if they have card racks for social services information. Through conversation with the librarians we talk about supporting them getting people information not being all knowing of all the social service information like WIC/SNAP/TANF or ERAP, and fuel assistance.





The Great Pumpkin Milford

Milford Kids Thrive partners, including the Milford School District, Milford Thrives and Waypoint, participated in Milford Recreation's Trick or Treat on the Oval event. We're happy to report that we engaged with 200+ Milford families with young children.

Also in October, Milford's Wadleigh Library hosted Milford Kids Thrive partners for their "Great Pumpkin" Little Explorers event. The Collaborative partners joined the children's library staff to host a variety of fun, hands-on STEAM activities and to share resources with parents and caregivers.

ACERT Expansion

YWCA New Hampshire has received Congressionally Directed Spending to fund an ACERT Expansion project. The goal of the project is to expand the ACERT (Adverse Childhood Experiences Response Team) program to 10 new communities in NH, increase services and capacity of existing ACERT partners, and enhance DEI training and competency among all ACERT partners. PTAN Celebrates its 30th Anniversary!

2022 marks the thirtieth year of the Preschool Technical Assistance Network (PTAN), a grant-funded project that provides professional development services statewide.

Two big changes are happening this year. First, PTAN is now affiliated with the Pyramid Model Consortium. This affiliation offers us a new fiscal agent and access to many resources and opportunities to better support NH early care and education programs. The second change is the award of a new contract from the NH DHHS Bureau of Child Development and Head Start Collaboration.

We are very pleased to receive grant-funding to continue our work supporting NH child care programs with free consultation and training infused with Pyramid Model evidence-based practices to prevent suspension and expulsion and promote teacher retention. This contract also expands our scope of services to include supporting the roll out of NH's new quality recognition and improvement system (QRIS) known as Granite Steps for Quality (GSQ). Our efforts will specifically focus on the GSQ Pyramid Model Pathway. PTAN will provide programs who have achieved Step 1 and higher with a Program Coach who will guide them along this pathway with infrastructure development, practice-based coaching, and training.

Many aspects of our project will feel familiar. Long-time PTAN Project Director, Joan Izen will continue in her role, as will Project Coordinator, Hillary Pincoske. Project services will be provided by a cohort of skilled, knowledgeable, and caring consultants, coaches, and trainers, many of whom are NH Pyramid Model Master Cadre members.

Helping Hands and Local Engagement

In Region 4, we are working with our programs that are part of our Early Learning Collaborative. Lisa Piccolo and Heather McKinnon, at LAUNCH Manchester, with feedback from providers, developed some creative ideas to celebrate the programs and teachers that are part of the ELC. Lisa and Heather have been visiting the programs, reading some of their favorite books and doing activities with the children. The teachers were able to take a few minutes to do things in their classroom while the children had fun with the books and the activities. Some of the books were "Dragons Love Tacos", "Annie and the Wild Animals", "The Color Monster" and "Cant You Sleep Little Bear". The children created moons with clay, color monsters with construction paper shapes, water color dragons made from paper plates and bird feeders with pines cones.









ECE Training in the Community

Over the past several months, EC Coalitions and EC Regions have hosted local training for early care and education providers. Greater Derry Launch held a successful professional development conference called "Fill Your Cup". Topics included play and nature based learning, family engagement, self-care among others.

EC Region 6, Stafford County and Seacoast hosted a well-received training where participants learned about self-reflection techniques to identify potential biases and then selected additional training on either Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)/Positive Childhood Experiences (PCEs) or Building Positive Behaviors.

"Supporting You, Our Early Care and Education Superheroes Who Inspire the Future!" was the title of the event sponsored by Great Nashua Smart Start. Participants learned about trauma-responsive approaches/care for young children in the classroom (birth - age 8), as well as address mental health support/self-care for educators.
